- We presented "The Role of Occupational Therapy in Aged Care" at the Aged Care Forum convened by GP Cairns' Aged Care Panel.

New services

We have been working at expanding our expertise in several areas over the last few years. One of these is optimising recovery following mastectomy.

- ★ Improving arm movement and prevent stiffness and tight muscles affecting everyday tasks.
- * Improving the appearance of scars, +/- implants and reducing the impact of scarring on lymphatic drainage and shoulder movement.
- * Teaching how to improve lymphatic drainage and reducing the risks of developing chronic oedema / lymphoedema.
- ★ Teaching self-management of lymphoedema, if it does occur, via massage, exercises, compression bandaging / garments if necessary.



We are pleased to have assisted a greater number of **Enhanced Primary Care** clients this year and look forward to continuing to provide EPC services and being able to use the new code for people of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander descent.

We are keen to assist more clients who are in **low level care** in Residential Aged Care Facilities via EPC funding. Please contact us if you would like more info about how we can assist.

We have an interest in seeing any **musicians**, of all levels, that have upper limb problems affecting their playing.
